Charles L. Jones, 75, a former O'Neillite who spent many years in Colfax county and served for a time in the state legislature, is dead.

He succumbed on Wednesday, January 17, in a Columbus hospital. The late Mr. Jones, who lived at Schuyler, has been in failing health for several years and bedfast for four months.

Funeral rites were conducted Saturday afternoon, January 20, at Schuyler, at the Presbyterian church.

Charles L. Jones was the son of George W. and Emma Bonnie Jones. He was born in Eastman, Wisc., April 4, 1875.

Mr. Jones married Miss Phoebe Storts in Fremont December 4, 1897. They went to Schuyler soon after this and Mr. Jones became superintendent of a chicory factory. In 1912 he bought a farm northwest of Schuyler, which became the family home.

Mr. Jones served three two-year terms as a state legislator representing Colfax county, elected in 1925-1927-1929. He was a past master of the Masonic lodge and affiliated with the Presbyterian church.

Mrs. Jones preceded her husband in death. She passed away

in 1942.

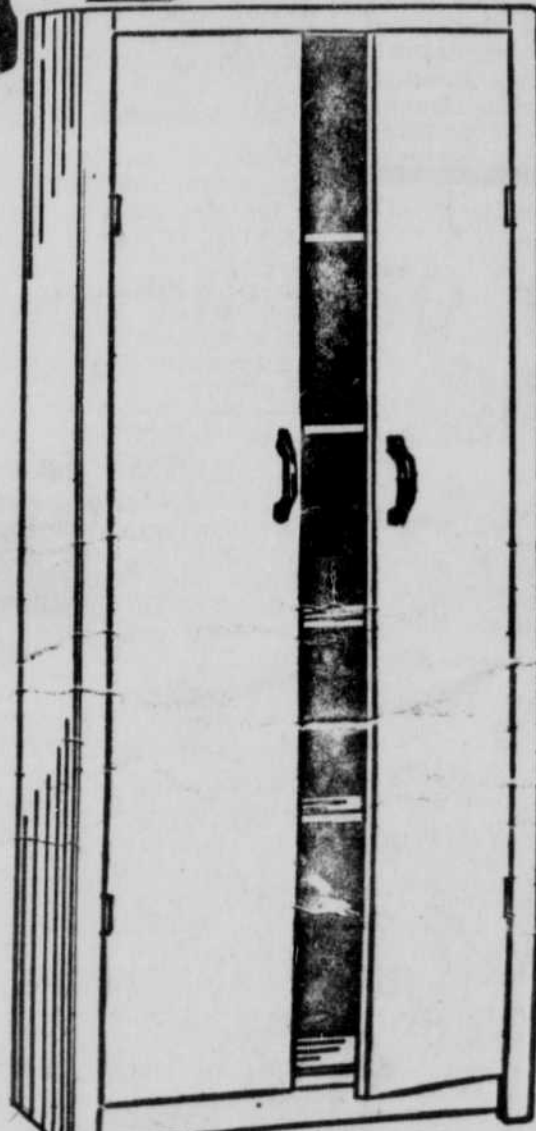
