THE PRIMARY ELECTION BRINGS OUT FAIR VOTE

The primary election held last Tuesday was a very quiet one in Holt county although a fairly good vote was cast. The day was ideal for holding the election.

The contest for the offices of county judge and state representative perhaps contributed liberally toward the number of votes cast as the contestants have been working hard for the past few weeks. C. J. Malone, the present county judge, received the highest vote, for the nomination for judge M. H. McCarthy was second, J. H. Meredith third and Sheridan Simmons was fourth. The two receiving the highest number of votes are the candidates for the office at the coming general election this fall.

In the race for state representative C. E. Havens, of Atkinson, won over T. F. Birmingham, Charles Kirkland and Fred Cronk.

Judge Robert R. Dickson received a majority of 1973 votes over his opponent, Wm. M. Ely, of Ainsworth, for district judge from the fifteenth district comprising Rock, Brown, Keya Paha, Boyd and Holt counties.

Spillman carried Holt county by 136 over Howells for U. S. Senator.

MRS. HARRIETT AUGUSTA MARTIN

Mrs. Harriett Augusta Martin of this city passed away Wednesday afternoon in the Nicholas Senn hospital in Omaha where she has been confined for the passed six weeks at the age of 75 years, 6 months and 15 days. Heart failure was given as the cause of her death.

Mrs. Martin was born in Big Indian, Ulster County, New York, September 27, 1852. She was married to Bennett Martin, at Kingston, New York, on September 29, 1869. She came to Holt county with her husband and family in 1877 and located upon a homestead a short distance southeast of Meek postoffice where they resided for a number of years. They later moved to O'Neill where Mrs. Martin resided until her death.

The deceased leaves the following children to mourn her departure: Merritt J., Buffalo, Wyoming; Frank G., Riverton, Wyoming; Burl H., Kansas City, Missouri; Mrs. Opie Chambers, Yankton, South Dakota; Mrs. G. M. Henry, Hanover, Montana; Mrs. Pete Hereford, O'Neill; Walter K. passed away a few years ago.

The remains of Mrs. Martin will arrive in O'Neill Saturday morning at 7:32. Funeral services will be held from the Methodist church Sunday afternoon at two o'clock, conducted by Rev. G. W. Ballard.

The children will all be present at the funeral services of their mother excepting Merritt, Buffalo, Wyoming, who will be unable to reach here on account of a blizzard that has been raging in Wyoming.

ALBERT BREINER.

Albert Breiner, formerly a resident near this city, was found dead in a bed at a rooming house in Kearney, Nebraska, last Sunday. The body was brought to O'Neill arriving here Tuesday night.

The deceased was born in November 11, 1875, at McComb, Illinois, where he resided during his early life. He was united in marriage to Miss Theresa M. Robinson, at Palmer, Nebraska, in 1898; they came to Holt county and located near Atkinson, Nebraska; later they moved to Oklahoma where they remained for two or three years; they again came to Holt county about ten or twelve years ago and continued to make their home here. For the past two years Mr. Breiner has been working near Kearney, while his family remained near O'Neill.

The remains were brought to O'Neill Tuesday night and taken to the Biglin undertaking parlors. Funeral services will be held from the Methodist church Friday afternoon at two o'clock conducted by Rev. G. W. Ballard. Burial will be made in Prospect Hill cemetery.

The children are Mrs. Floyd Johnson, O'Neill; Mrs. G. H. Bailey, Los Angeles, California; Miss Lois Breiner, Omaha; Herber Breiner, Stapleton, Nebraska; Gerald Breiner, O'Neill; Mrs. E. C. Wright, Norfolk Nebraska; Alden Breiner, Wynona, Yvonne and Dona Ray Breiner, O'Neill.

All the children are here for the funeral service excepting Mrs. G. M. Bailey, of Los Angeles, whose husband has been quite ill.

The following account of the death of Mr. Breiner appeared in the daily press:

"Albert Breiner, 54, O'Neill, was found dead in bed at a local rooming house here today. Injuries suffered two weeks ago when he was thrown to the ground while loading hogs is believed to have caused a hemorrhage which resulted in his death.

The body was sitting up in bed when found. An open bible was on the bed and the light in the room was burning. Breiner was last seen Saturday night.

His widow and ten children survive."
