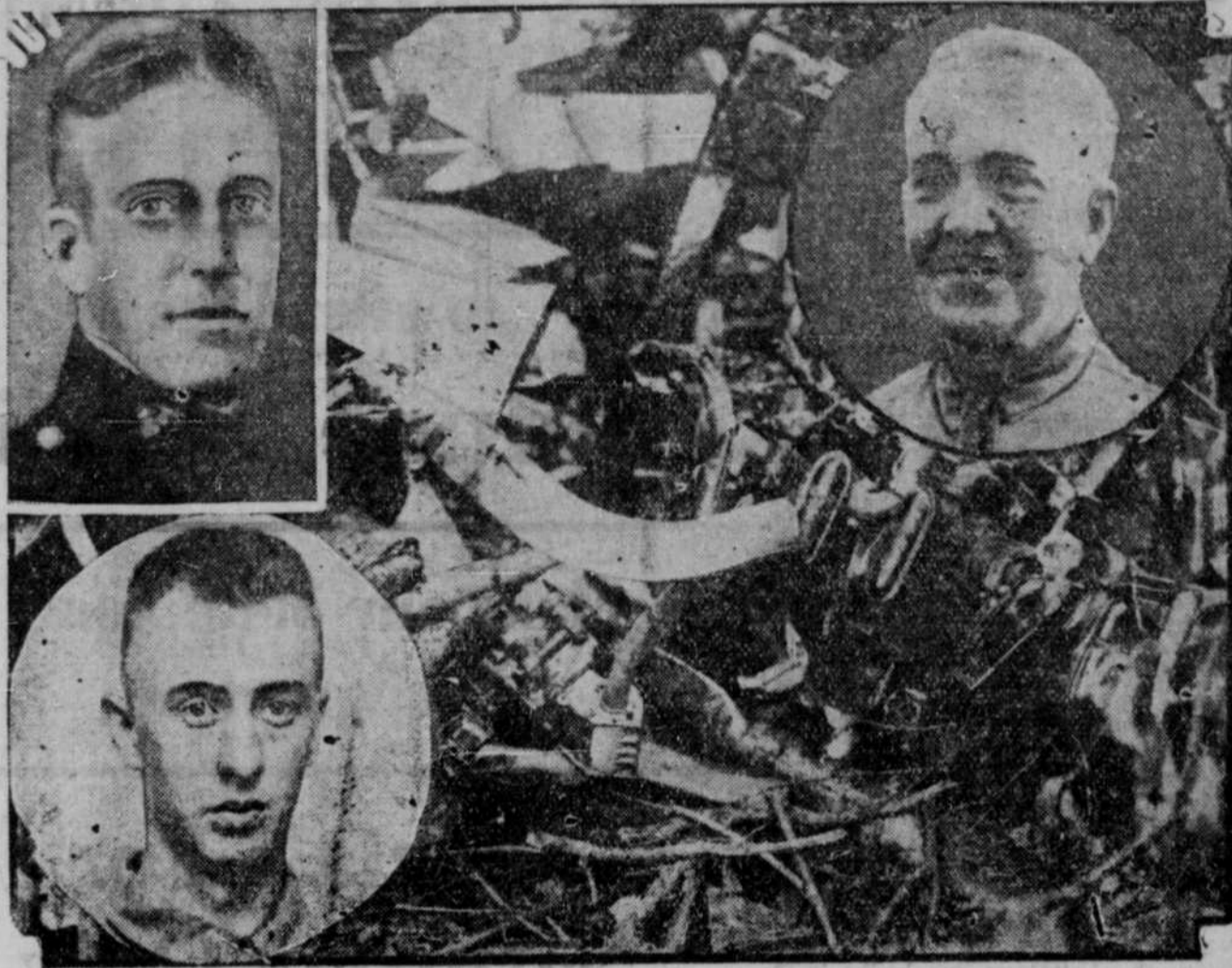


Three Die in Marine Plane Crash



Scarcely an hour after he took off from Bolling field, Major Charles A. Lutz (inset at right), the Navy's speed champion, and two of his three aides, Lieut. H. T. Busbey (above at left), U. S. M. C., and Corporal D. C. Chesney (below at left), were killed when their giant tri-motored transport plane crashed and somersaulted to splinters near Fife, Va., 100 miles south of the capital. Dies After Wound



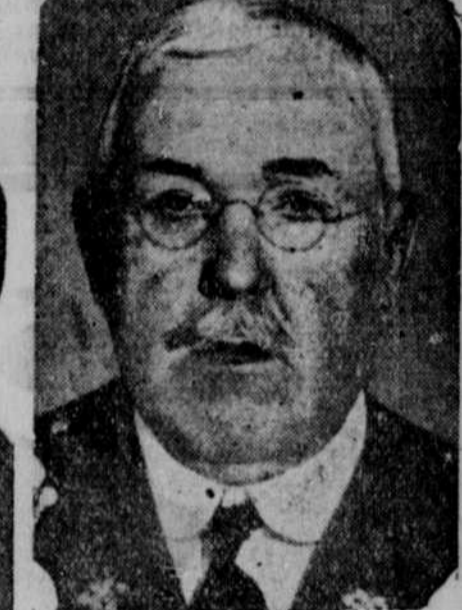
