Bill Perry Suggests Peanut Tart Shells?

Ever eat peanut tart shells? Bill Perry, sales supervisor of the local Meadow Gold dairy recommends them as edible little containers for the dairy's new Triple Fruit Sherbet. Because of the refreshing tartness and pretty pastel coloring of this popular lemon, lime and orange sherbet trio you don't need a sauce or other topping for it.

Beatrice Cooke, director of the company's Chicago test kitchens developed the pastry recipe for those who like the contrast salty nuts give to ice creams and sherbets.

Triple Fruit Peanut Tarts
(Eight Servings)
2 cups sifted flour
1/3 cup butter
1/3 cup shortening
2/3 cup finely chopped salted peanuts
5 to 6 tablespoons cold water
2 pints Triple Fruit Sherbet

Cut shortening into flour with pastry blender or two knives until mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Stir in chopped peanuts. Add water, a tablespoon at a time and stir with fork until dough holds together. Chill. Roll out on floured surface and cut into rounds 4 inches in diameter. Fit pastry over outside of muffin pans and prick bottom and sides with a fork. Bake 9 to 10 minutes in a 450 degree oven. Cool. Fill tarts with Triple Fruit Sherbet.
