1 egg, beaten
1 1/2 cups dairy sour cream
2 tablespoons butter, melted
Sift together flour, corn meal, sugar, baking powder, soda and salt. Combine egg, sour cream and butter. Add to dry ingredients; stir until dry ingredients are just moistened. Fill greased muffin pan 2/3 full. Bake at 400 degrees for 25 minutes.
