The Don Kaup family visited in the Lawrence Kaup home at Atkinson Friday evening.

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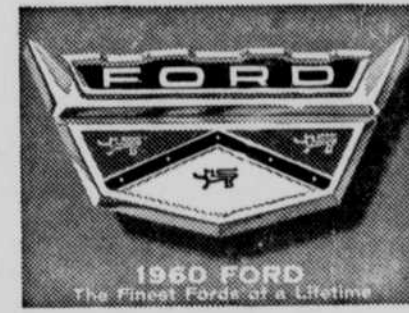
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
