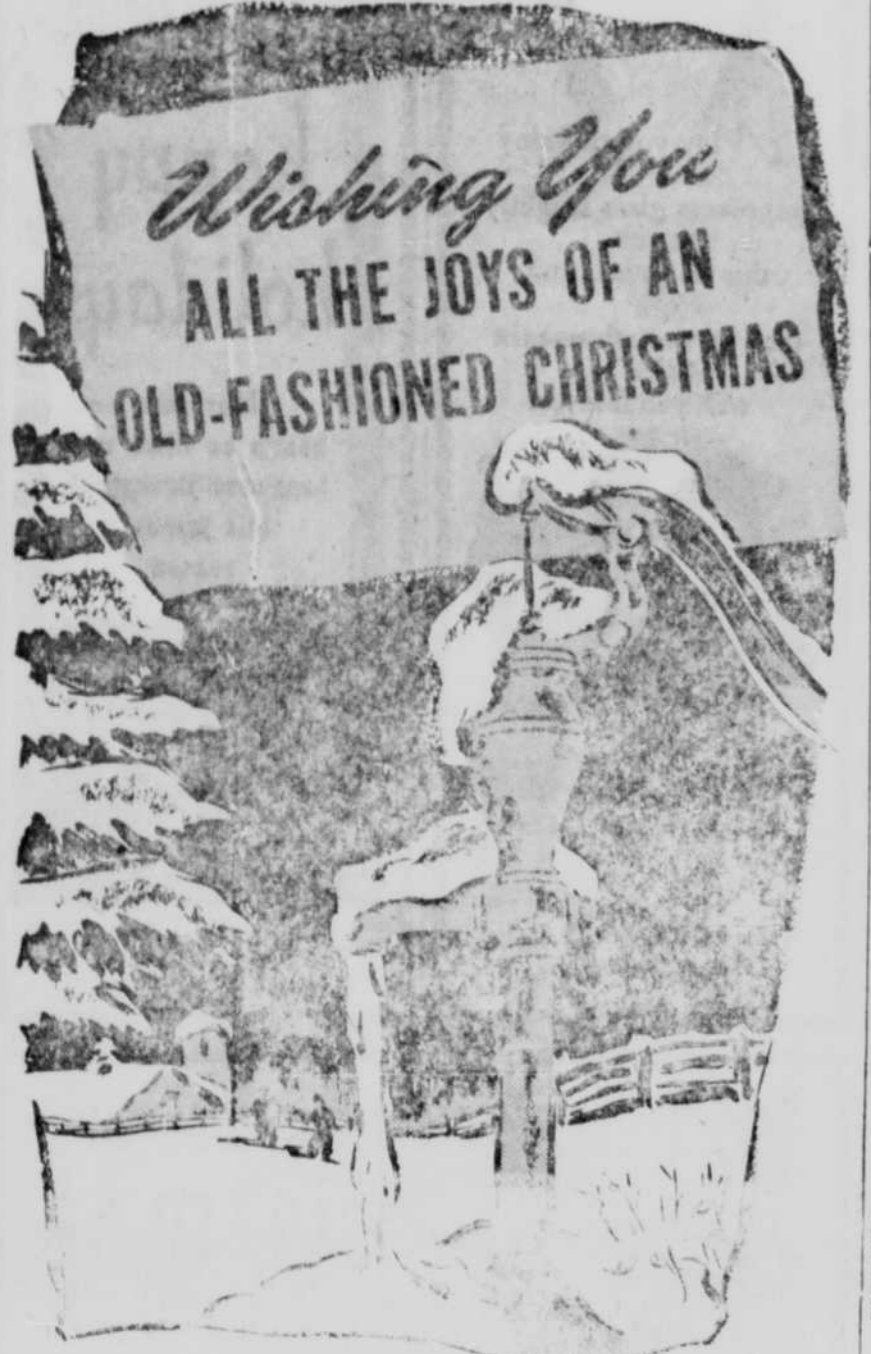
exchanged. The next meeting will be January 7 at the home of Mrs. J. G. Brewster.

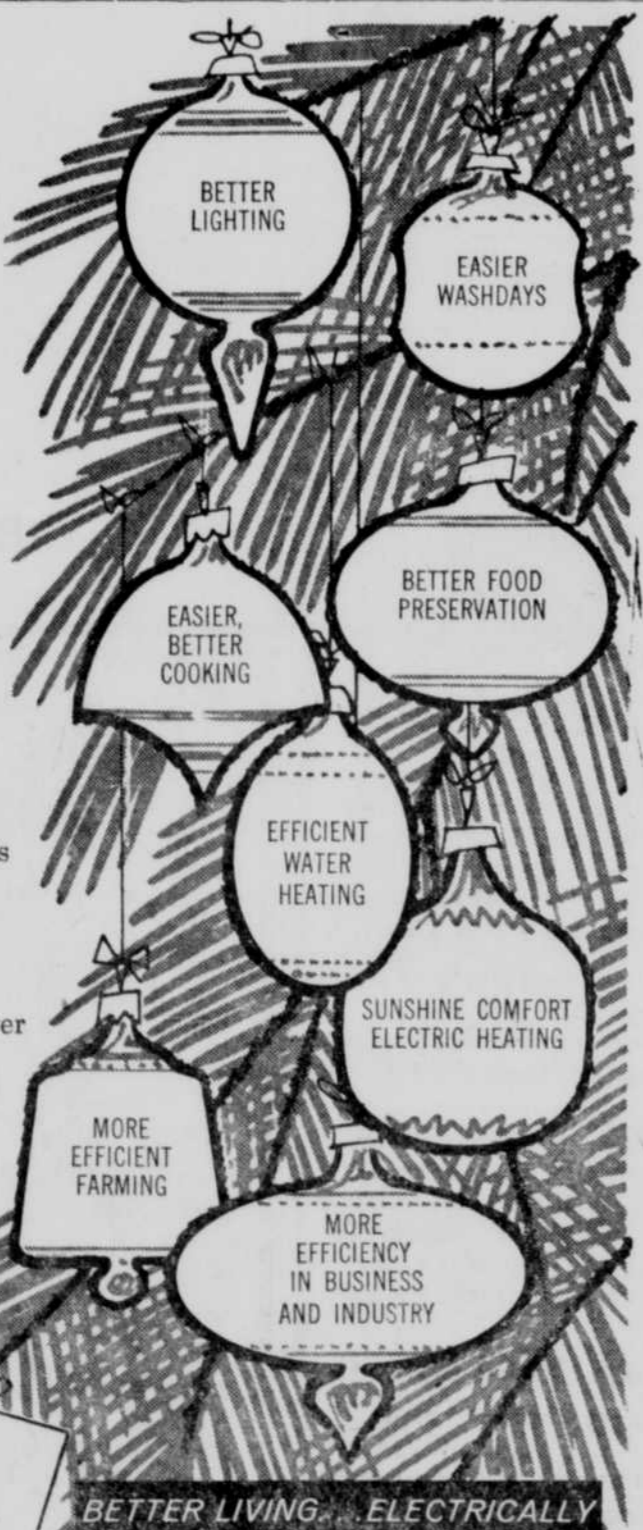
