(Bob) Hill, work unit conservationist for Holt, says: "The Great Plains conservation program enables the farmer or rancher to complete a soil and water conservation plan on his unit in a short period of time with the technical assistance by the trained men of the soil conservation service and the cost-sharing of fed-
