Eighteen Ranchers In Holt County To Use 'Great Plains' Study

Eighteen farmers and ranchers of Holt county are increasing the productive potential of their units with the aid of the Great Plains conservation program.

The program was installed by Congress two years ago to provide the kind of help that will stay on the land, said that will reduce the hazards of drought and erosion of the soil caused by wind and water.

Principal offering is a complete soil and water conservation plan for ranch or farm unit based on the careful studies of range and soil condition and made to fit the needs of the unit and the operator.

Cost-sharing of federal funds is set up to get the conservation job speeded up and done in less than three years nor more than 10 years on any farm or ranch.

C. R. (Bob) Hill, work unit conservationist for Holt, says: "The Great Plains conservation program enables the farmer or rancher to complete soil and water conservation plan on his unit in a short period of time with the technical assistance by the trained men of the soil conservation service and the cost-sharing of federal funds.

Since the program was established in Holt in early 1958, the following practices have been completed:

Four livestock water dams and two erosion control dams, six livestock wells, 34 acres of land leveling or irrigation, one mile of waterway development, 22 acres of livestock shelterbelts, four miles of fencing, 544 acres of native grass planting, and 170 acres of tame pasture planting.
