### Homemakers Corner . . .

**Thin to work as well as pray. Clearing thorns away. Plucking up the weeds of sin. Letting heaven's warm sunshine in.**

**Whittier**  
 March rode in rough and stormy. Already we have felt a few warmer days, also an additional accumulation of snow. We received seven inches of snow Tuesday.

Researchers are now turning their wits toward the eliminating of the "pucker problem" in sewing. Women who do a lot of sewing especially with "wash and wear" fabrics have experienced this problem.

Opal Roberson, extension clothing and textiles specialist of Iowa State University states that researchers are now working on a "wash and wear" thread. They are now endeavoring to bring to the sewing public a resintreated thread to be used on wash and wear fabric. As yet it isn't on the market.

Since we can't buy this thread Miss Roberson suggests the need for adjusting your sewing machines by loosening both the upper and lower tension to avoid puckering when sewing on these fabrics.

### JELLY POINTS

Make a "Sweet Roll Dough" as follows:  
 3/4 cup milk  
 1/4 cup butter or margarine  
 1/3 cup sugar  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 2 packages active dry yeast or 2 cakes fresh yeast  
 2 eggs, beaten  
 4 1/2 to 5 cups sifted flour  
 Scald milk in small saucepan. Stir in sugar, shortening and salt. Cool to lukewarm.

Measure warm water into large bowl (cool to lukewarm for fresh yeast); then sprinkle or crumble yeast into water and let dissolve; mix in lukewarm milk and beaten eggs.

Gradually add the flour till you have the right amount which will allow the irregular ball of dough to come away from sides of bowl. Then turn dough onto board and knead into it sufficient flour to keep dough from sticking to hands and board. Put into a greased bowl, cover and let rise about 50 min. or until it has doubled in bulk.

Divide raised dough and cut each half in 12 equal-size pieces. Form balls and place in greased muffin cups. Brush lightly with softened butter or margarine. Put in a warm place, cover and let raise for 25 minutes. Before placing in oven preheat oven and cut almost through to the bottom of each roll. Put in moderate oven (375 degrees) for 15 minutes. Remove and fill each center of roll with a teaspoonful of jam and bake an additional 5 minutes. Serve hot.
