Lloyd Gillespie Killed Sunday in Auto Crash

Lloyd G. Gillespie, 85, an 83-year-old educator of O'Neill and Holt county, died Sunday evening in St. Anthony's hospital as a result of a two-car accident occurring in mid-afternoon.

The accident happened at the intersection of the airport-country club road and highway 281, Clarence Latzel, Ewing the driver of the other car involved, and Alvin Hamilton, also of Ewing and a passenger in the Latzel auto, were both hospitalized but released shortly.

According to Sheriff Leo Tomjack, who investigated the accident, the car driven by Mr. Gillespie was traveling east. He evidently failed to see the approaching Latzel auto and drove into the highway. Latzel was unable to

stop and struck the Gillespie car broadside. Both cars were completely demolished. Mr. Gillespie's auto was knocked off the road and into the ditch bordering the O'Neill cemetery.

Sunday golfers at the O'Neill country club heard the impact in every corner of the course. Mr. Gillespie's son, Ben was at the far eastern end of the course and was one of the first to the scene.

Gillespie was a former member of the O'Neill city council and former city assessor. He long was prominent in the Odd Fellows Lodge.

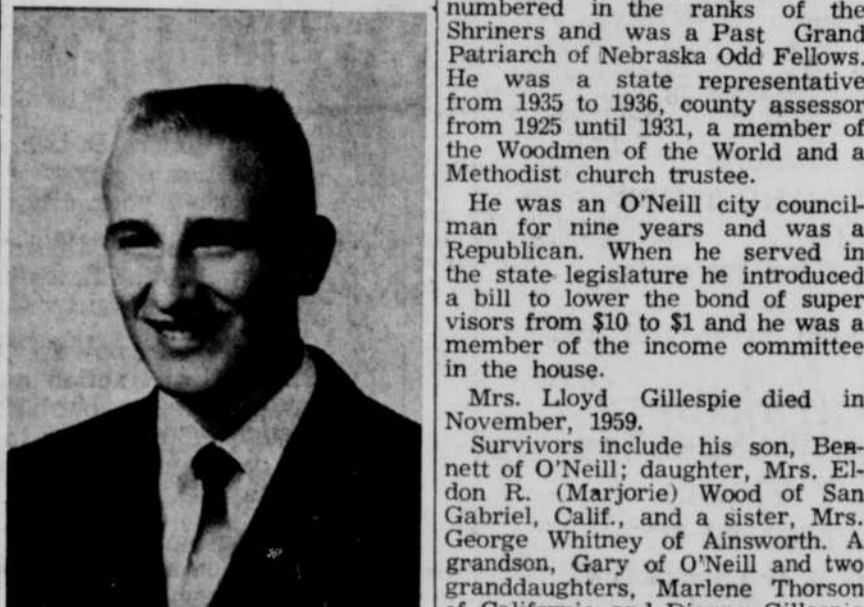
