It is a forgone conclusion that many hardships and difficulties will be encountered. These can only be corrected by the entire community supporting the new school bond issue, the accreditation of the school is also in jeopardy. A number of people have been commenting that the half sessions are not necessary. Presently we have 14 elementary orons and 17 teachers. All teachers will have from 22-30 students in each section, these will vary. The crowded conditions are not a temporary thing and will get progressively worse.

If we count only our fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students that we had last year: fifth-52, sixth-47, seventh-42, eighth-50, we will have 191 students in high school in 1965 not counting any students from the country for free high school.

For years we have been receiving between 15 and 20 each year or an average of somewhere around 60 F.H.S. Assuming that we have about that number and we have no reason to believe it will increase, we can conceivably have 20 in high school. The high school classes now are at a point where if they get larger, we will have to divide them into another section and this will call for more teaching stations. The Board and the administration have evaluated every available space. Up to now, elementary classrooms were taken from high school rooms and thereby cramping the high school. The projection room was remodeled, and made into a classroom, there is no room available. An additional half day division might have been made in the first grade, however, it was felt that the youngsters at this age are unable to help themselves and despite the two classes in one room, and rather large enrollments, the class was not divided into half day sections.
