Judy Bartak, Norfolk, spent the weekend at the home of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bartak and family.

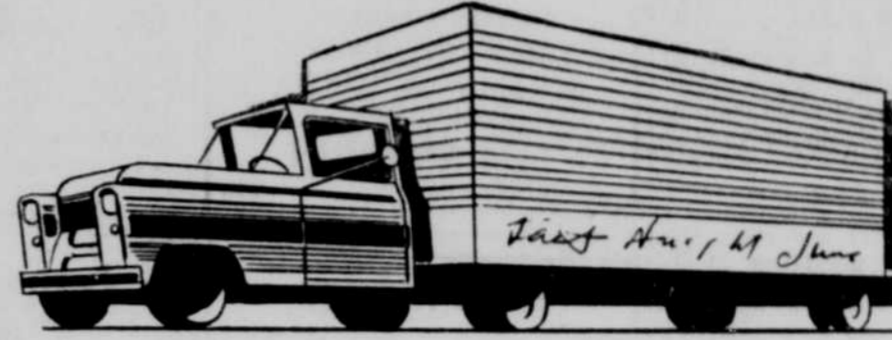

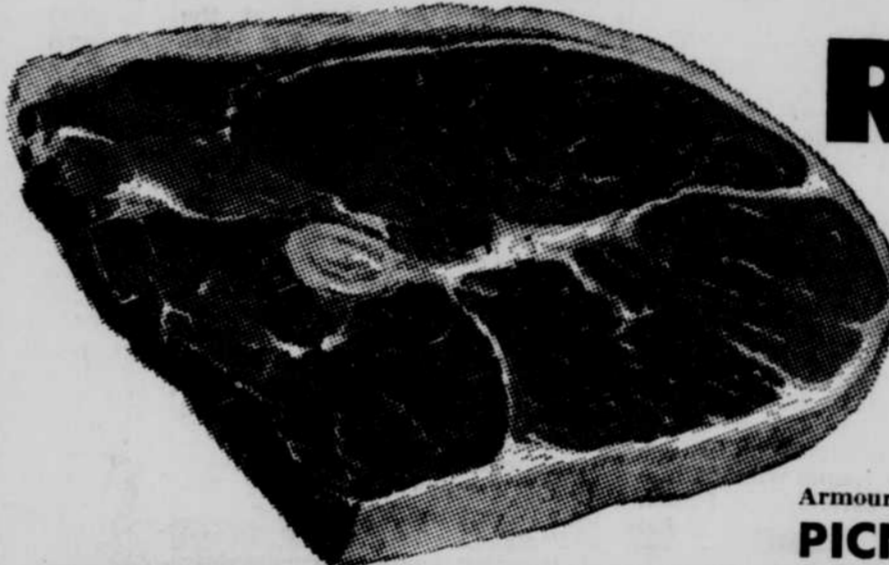

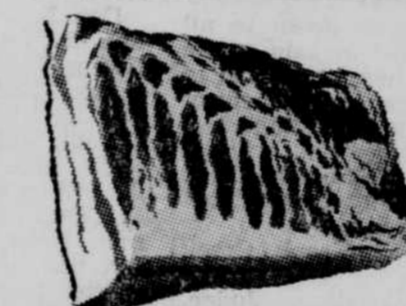
