Mrs. O'Malley is a graduate of the Ewing high school and has been employed by Western Power and Gas Company in Columbus.

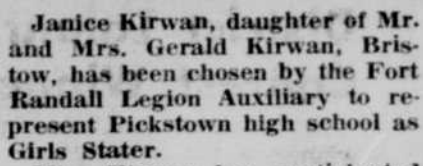
The bridegroom is a graduate of St. Joseph's high school in Atkinson. He is now engaged in ranching.

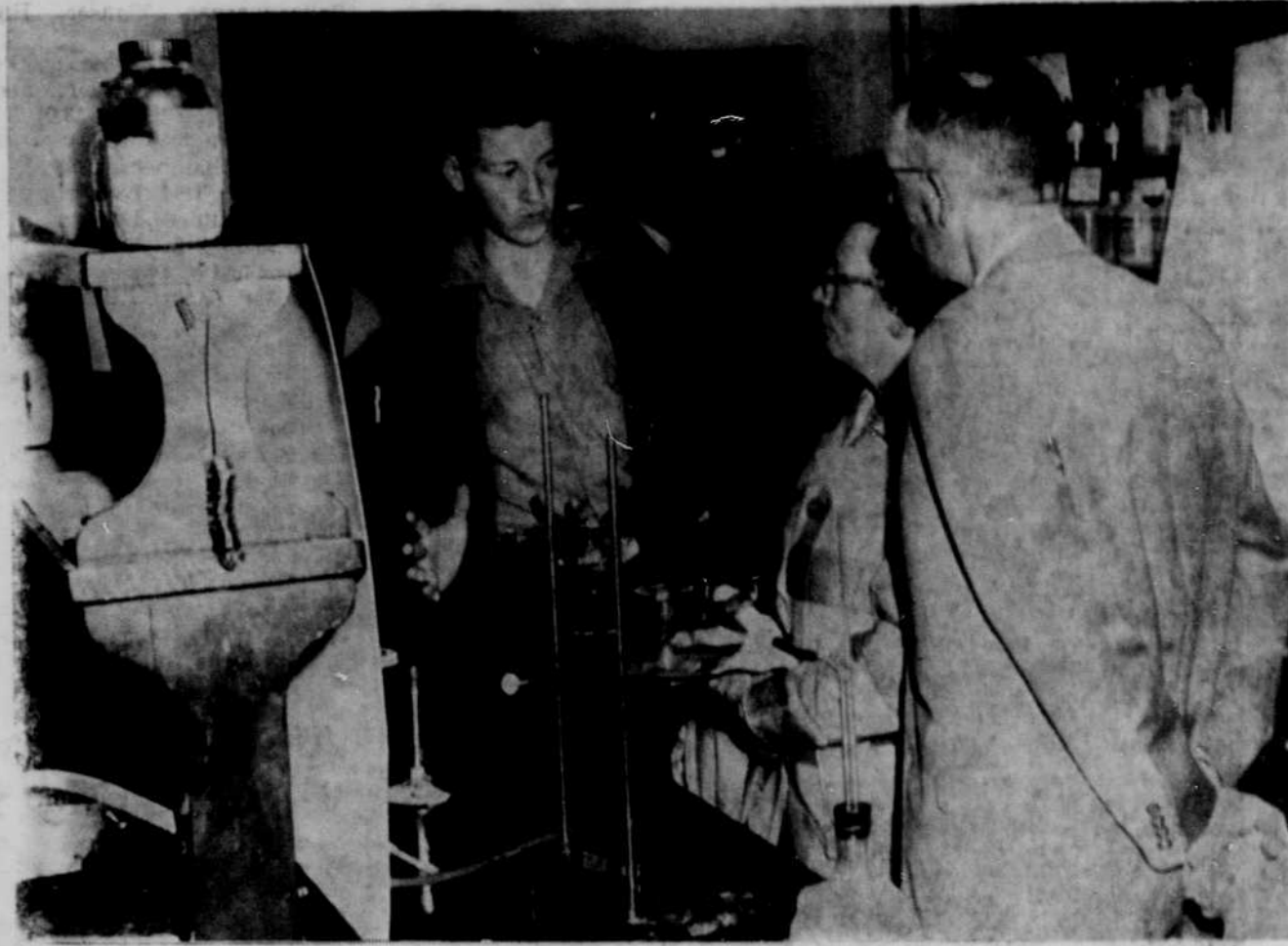
