**Wed in New Orleans**

Elmwood Plantation on the Mississippi River Road in New Orleans was the setting for the wedding of Jeannine Claire Maranga, New Orleans, and Dr. Lionel C. Ickes, Page, Saturday evening at six p.m., May 12, 1962.

Rev. Miles Gebauer, retired Lutheran minister and life-long friend of the Matranga family, performed the double ring ceremony.

White gladioli masked the tall outdoor candleholders that edged the brick walk from the house to the river. They were topped with blue candles in globe holders.

White wedding bells topped the bower and white gladioli flanked the dais set up for the occasion midway between the house and river.

Ralph Skiffin, soloist, sang "Because" and "If I Could Tell You".

The bride, escorted by her father appeared from the side entrance of the plantation house, traversed the wide veranda and walked down the path to the outdoor cathedral.

The bride's gown of Chantilly lace and net over bride's satin was fashioned with a moulded bodice with re-embroidered alençon lace edging the cap sleeves and framing the portrait neckline.

The lavishly full three-tier cutaway skirt cascaded from the hipline into a cathedral train. Her veil of illusion net was caught in a coronation crown. She wore full length gloves and carried a bouquet of white flowers.

The bride's only jewelry was a single strand of pearls, a gift from her father to her mother many years ago.

Maid of Honor, Alyce Urauhart and bridesmaid Donna Bethune, both of New Orleans and friends of the bride wore identical gowns of yellow organza with matching picture hats and butterfly cummerbunds. Allison Spindel was flower girl and wore a full skirted dress of white organza with a crown of fresh flowers.

All the bride's attendants carried baskets of mixed garden flowers.

The bride's mother was attired in a beige gown of alençon lace with matching accessories while the mother of the bridegroom wore a pale green dress of cupini cotton. Both wore cymbidium orchid corsages.

Following the ceremony a reception for five hundred guests was given by the bride's parents. The main hall of the Plantation House served as the reception center with the line forming before the magnolia-banked fire place.

A buffet supper was served in the north garden. Music was furnished by the Frankie Mann orchestra and later by the Dixie Land Jazz Band with dancing throughout the evening.

The bride is a graduate of New Orleans high school and Ridge Wood Preparatory school. She has been hostess at the Plantation since her graduation.

The bridegroom is a graduate of Page high school, attended the University of Nebraska and received his Bachelor of Arts and College of Veterinary Medicine degrees from the Colorado A & M University at Ft. Collins. At the conclusion of his service assignment Dr. and Mrs. Ickes will make their home at Nampa, Ida., where he will practice with his brother, Dr. M. W. Ickes.

The bride chose a navy blue polka dot cotton with a white jabot and jacket for her going away dress. Her corsage was a white cymbidium orchid.

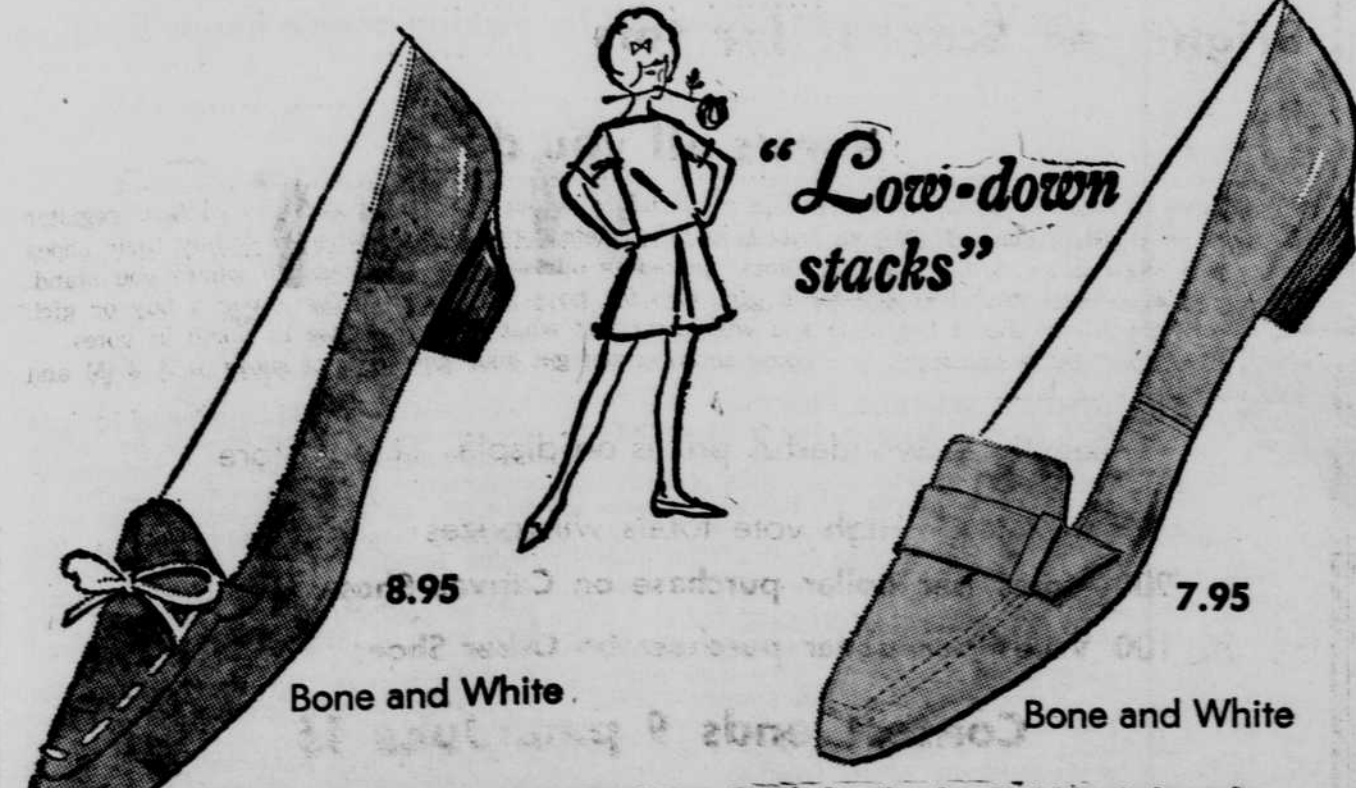
