

Junior Legion Drops Decision To Gregory, S. D.

The O'Neill Junior Legion traveled to Gregory, S. D. Friday night and dropped a 6-5 decision in a non-conference dual. South-paw Terry Flakyst was given credit for the victory although he needed help from Eddie Antelope in the fifth. Ray Belina started for O'Neill and took the loss, he was followed on the mound by Keith Reynoldson in the fourth and Dennis Wentz in the fifth.

The local Legion took an early 3-0 lead on a long bases-loaded single by Wentz in the third frame that scored two runs, along with three walks and two Gregory errors. The home team came back with four big runs in the bottom of the third, then added lone runs in the fourth and fifth innings.

O'Neill threatened in the top of the seventh, scoring one run on an infield roller, but the contest ended with two O'Neill runners on base.

The Joe Ollendick crew out-hit the winners four hits to three, but O'Neill left eleven runners stranded. Wentz led the losers hitting with two singles and three runs-batted-in.

Gregory hurlers fanned fourteen while Belina, Reynoldson, and Wentz combined for eleven strike-outs.
