NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

January 1st is the assessment date. All property owned January 1, 1963 must be assessed for 1963.

The law requires everyone between the age of 21 and 60 to make out an Assessment schedule for old age tax. If you own property, you must make out an Assessment schedule regardless of age. This includes people living in trailer houses.

Due to a change in policy in the Assessor's office, all clergy-men will be assessed for their personal property.

The law requires the Assessor to add a penalty for all omitted property and late schedules. The penalty for tangible property is 50% of value. For intangible property, it is five times the amount of tax.

Intangible property is divided into two classes, A & B. Intangible "A" is money in the bank, savings accounts, cash on hand, and book accounts. This class of property is taxed for \$2.50 per \$1000. Intangible "B" is stock and shares in corporations, mutual funds, notes, building and loan, and many others. This class is taxed for \$4.00 per \$1000. Some of this is exempt. The law requires you to list all of your intangible class of property. The County Assessor will determine if it is exempt. If you are in doubt about any of this class of property, ask your County Assessor.
