Better known as Jean, he was born and reared in south Holt county and was graduated from Ewing high school. He received his bachelor of science degree in agriculture from the University of Nebraska in 1940 and thereafter went into graduate study in agronomy-plant breeding in particular-at Ohio State university. Shortly after World War II, Lambert obtained his doctor of philosophy degree at Ohio State and has since been employed by the University of Minnesota.

At the ag college in the Twin Cities, he has been in charge of soybean and barley research and has also conducted university classes in genetics and other plant studies

The first two months in Europe Lambert will headquarter in the small town of Svavlov. near Mahlmo, Sweden. He will travel from there to various experiment stations in Sweden and in neighboring countrie particularly Denmark, Finland and Holland; also in West Germany and Britain, if time per-
