Agronomist Enroute to Sweden

EWING—Dr. J. W. Lambert, son of Mrs. Carl Lambert of Ewing, is enroute this week from his home in St. Paul, Minn., to Scandinavia where he will carry on some plant breeding research.

He is being accompanied on the trip by his wife and their two sons, ages seven and four.

Doctor Lambert's work will be in cooperation with experiment stations in several countries.

Better known as Jean, he was born and reared in south Holt county and was graduated from Ewing high school. He received his bachelor of science degree in agriculture from the University of Nebraska in 1940 and thereafter went into graduate study in agronomy—plant breeding in particular—at Ohio State university. Shortly after World War II, Lambert obtained his doctor of philosophy degree at Ohio State and has since been employed by the University of Minnesota.

At the ag college in the Twin Cities, he has been in charge of soybean and barley research and has also conducted university classes in genetics and other plant studies.

The first two months in Europe Lambert will headquarter in the small town of Svalov, near Malmho, Sweden. He will travel from there to various experiment stations in Sweden and in neighboring countries, particularly Denmark, Finland and Holland; also in West Germany and Britain, if time permits.

About July 1 the Lamberts will move to Vollebeck, the chief agricultural college in Norway and a short distance from Oslo. The work in Norway, which is the basis for the trip, will concern cooperative research on crosses between two-rowed and six-rowed barley. A project started in Minnesota and being carried on in Norway.

On this tour Doctor Lambert will be an employee of the University of Minnesota, but his travel expense is provided by the Rockefeller Foundation. He and his family will return to the United States in August.
