Mrs. Carrie Taylor and daughters, Hazel and Floma, of Norfolk were Sunday dinner guests in the William Neuhauer home.

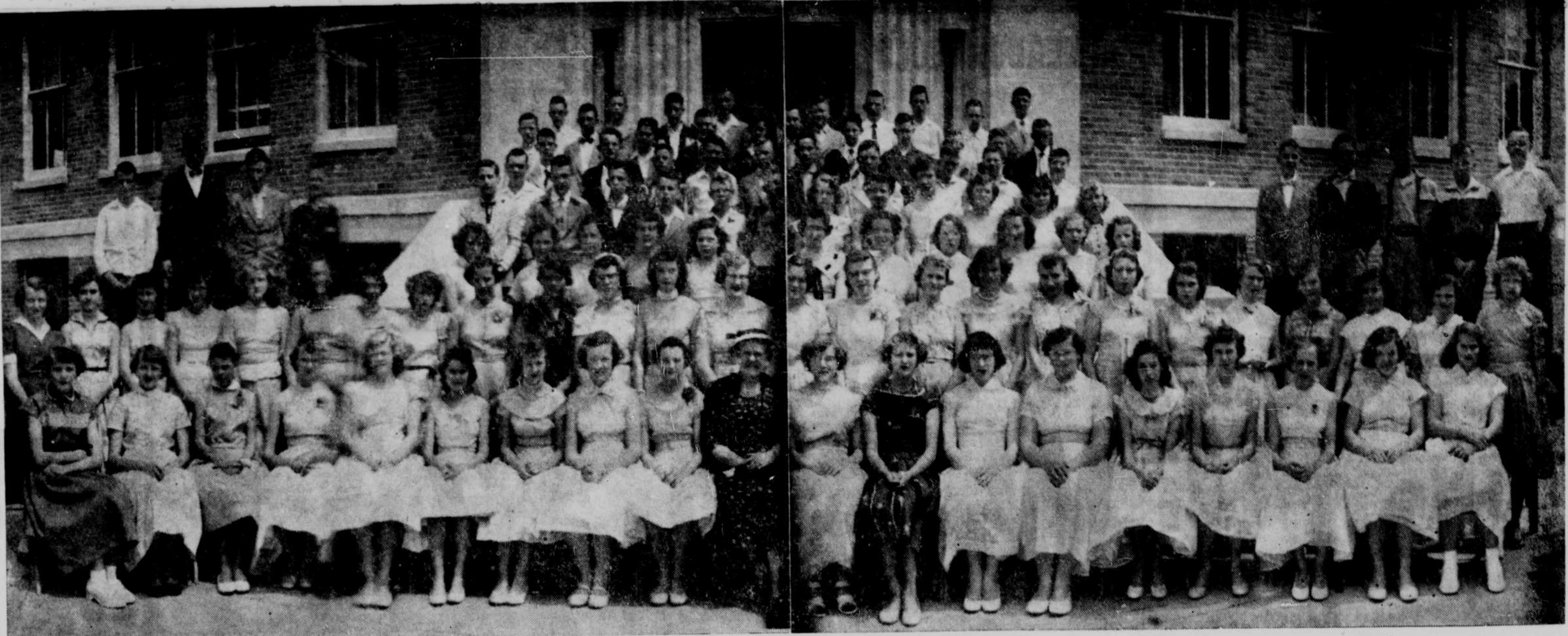

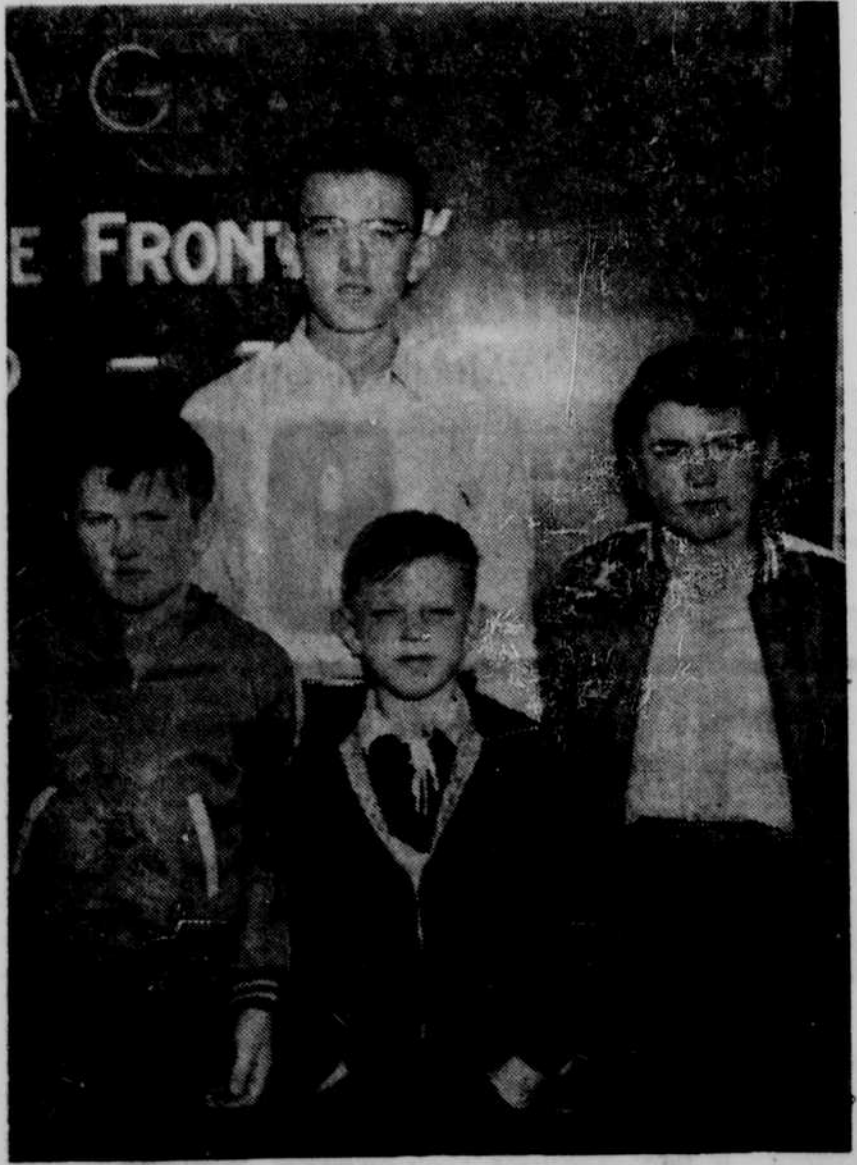
