**TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HOLT COUNTY, NEBRASKA**

We, the undersigned, legal residents, voters, and free-holders residing in the vicinity of the following described roads, and users of the same, do hereby respectfully petition and request that the Board of Supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska, will take the required action to make the following changes in the County Road System, as follows:

1. To abandon from the County Road System, the following described piece of County Road: Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section 25, in Township 26, North, Range 14, running thence South 1 mile, running thence West 6 miles to the Northwest corner of Section 31, in Township 26, North, Range 14.

2. To add to and make a part of the County Road System, the following described pieces of road: a. Commencing on the East Section Line of Section 17, in Township 26, North, Range 14, thence following the presently laid out Township Road West through said Section 17, and thence following said Township Road West to the Northwest corner of Section 18, in Township 26, North, Range 14, a total distance of approximately two miles.

b. Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section 27, in Township 26, North, Range 14, running thence South 2 miles to the Southeast corner of Section 34, in Township 26, North, Range 14, a total distance of approximately two miles.

c. Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section 27, in Township 25, North, Range 15, running thence South 1 mile to the Southeast corner of Section 27, a total distance of one mile.

d. Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section 22, in

Township 25, North, Range 15, running thence West 2 miles to the Northwest corner of Section 21, in Township 25, North, Range 15, a total distance of approximately two miles.

### NOTICE OF AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Notice is hereby given that the Articles of Incorporation of St. Peter's De Alcantara Church of Ewing, at a meeting duly held on March 26, 1956, were amended by the amendment of Articles 2, 3, 4 and 6 of the original Articles and the addition thereto of Article 8 to read substantially as follows:

1. The highest amount of indebtedness which said corporation shall be competent to contract shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars, beyond which amount this corporation has no power to contract debts binding at law or in equity upon it, its members or its property.

2. The officers by whom the affairs of the corporation shall be conducted are a president, treasurer and secretary. The Archbishop of the archdiocese to which said church belongs, or in case of a vacancy in that office, the Administrator of such archdiocese, shall be ex officio president. The treasurer shall be appointed by the president and the secretary elected by the members.

3. In order to perpetuate a line of succession in the members of the corporation, the Archbishop of the archdiocese to which the church belongs, or his successor in office, or in case of a vacancy, the Administrator of such archdiocese, the Vicar General, or his successor in office, or in case of a vacancy, shall be by virtue of such offices members of the corporation. By appointment made by the President, the Vicar General and the Pastor there shall be two lay members of the corporation.

4. The existence of this corporation commenced on May 5, 1914, and its existence thereafter shall be perpetual.

5. This corporation was organized and continues to exist under the classification of religious associations as defined in subdivision (3) of Section 21-834 Revised Statutes of Nebraska 1943, 1953 Cumulative Supplement. Dated May 1, 1956.

#### KILOWATT HOUR SALES

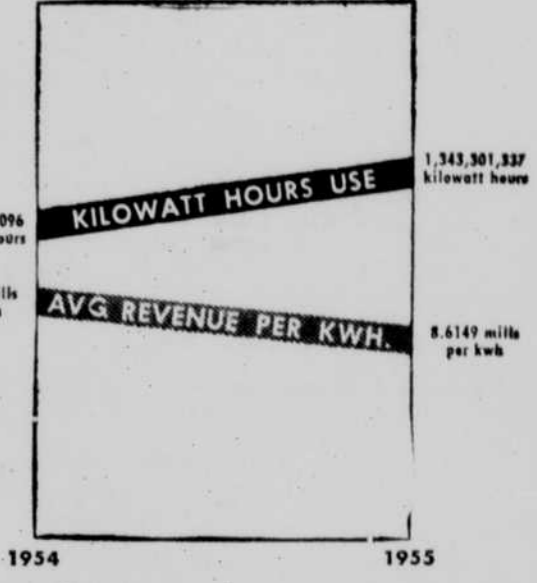

#### AVERAGE REVENUE PER KILOWATT HOUR

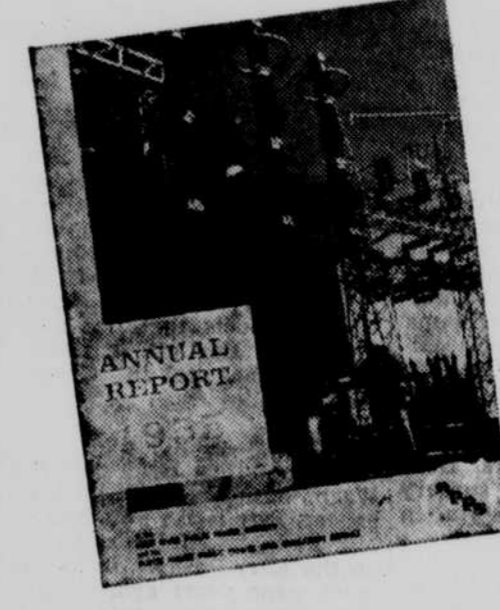
The average revenue\* in 1955 was 8.6149 mills per kilowatt hour, compared to the average of 8.7465 mills per kilowatt hour in 1954.
