Funeral services were conducted at 2 p.m., Tuesday, May 22, from the ZCJB hall at Verdigre.

The late Mrs. Vonasek, whose maiden name was Martha Prokop, was born at Verdigre, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Prokop. She attended Verdigre high school, was graduated in 1924, taught rural school several years and married Mr. Vonasek.

They became the parents of two daughters.

Survivors include: Widower; daughters—Mrs. Ray Zerbe of Verdigre and Mrs. Donald Miller of Venus; sisters—Mrs. Ben Vonasek of Star; the Misses Emma and Silva Prokop, both of Omaha; brother—Henry Prokop of Verdigre.

C. LeRoy Williams, missionary to Peru, South America, for years, will be the guest speaker at the Assembly of God church in O'Neill on Sunday, May 27, at 8 p.m. Mr. Williams will relate some of his experiences and will tell of the progress of missions in Peru.

After his furlough, Mr. Williams plans to return to Peru.
