

Burial Saturday for Mrs. Schrader

Lifelong Resident of Community

ATKINSON—Funeral services were conducted at St. John's Lutheran church here Saturday, June 9, for Mrs. Herman Schrader, sr., 65, a lifelong resident of this community. She died Wednesday evening, June 6, in Atkinson Memorial hospital.

She had been ill since suffering a heart attack July 28, 1934. Rev. E. W. Danitschek officiated and burial was in Wood Lawn cemetery.

Mrs. Schrader's maiden name was Amanda Amelia Dunn. She was born September 30, 1870, on a farm near here, married Mr. Schrader on July 20, 1908, and they became the parents of two sons, one of whom died in infancy.
