William ("Bill") Mattern, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce during the past 20 months, announced Wednesday he was resigning the position, effective June 30.

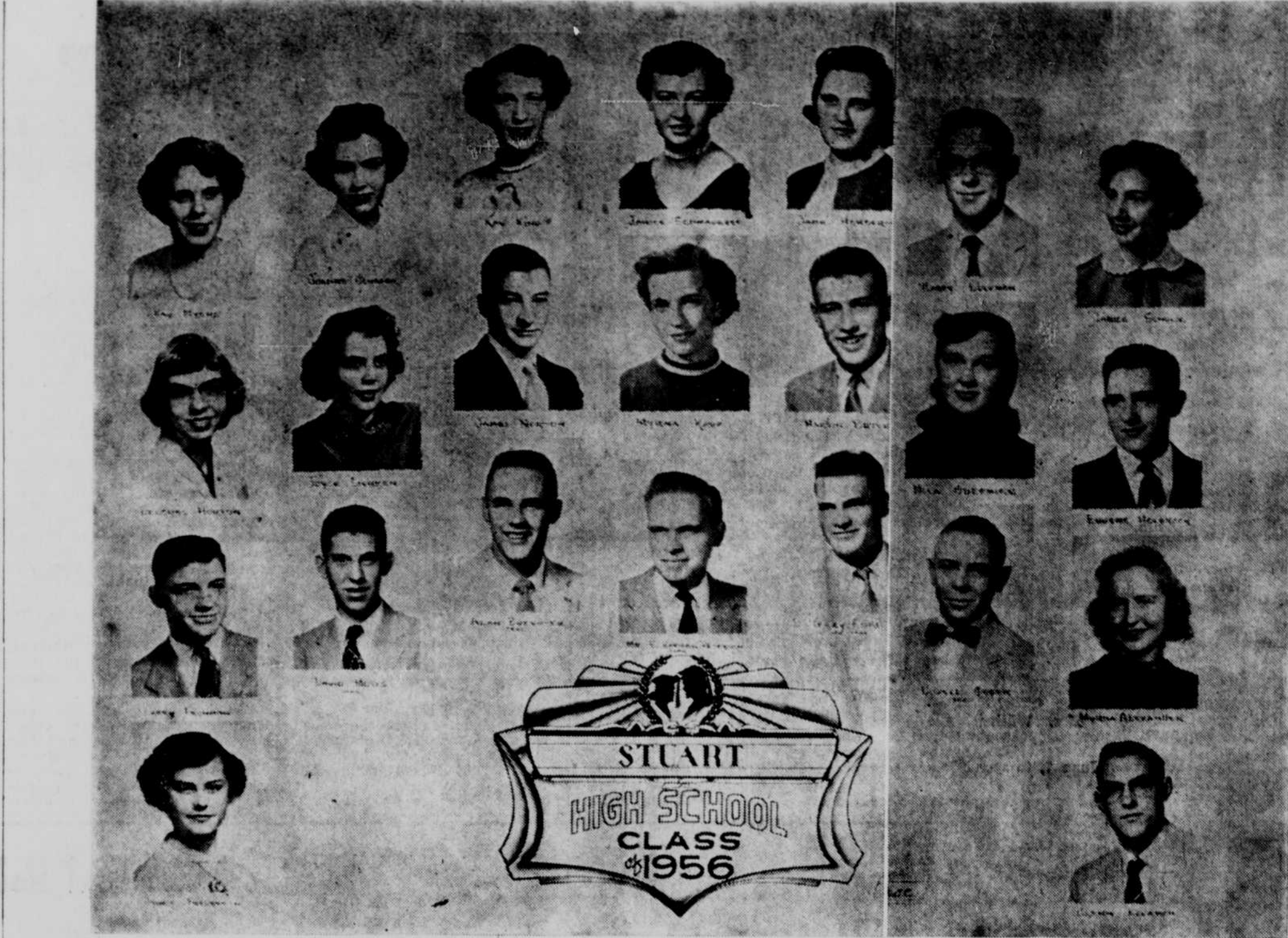
Mr. Mattern said the reason for quitting is because of the press of duties at the O'Neill Production association where he is assistant secretary-treasurer.
