Dr. George Stevens Burial in Omaha

A heart attack Wednesday night, June 20, at his home in Sioux Falls, S.D., claimed the life of Dr. George A. Stevens, 71, well-known physician and surgeon and a former resident of O'Neill.

He had practiced internal medicine at Sioux Falls 39 years and had been in semiretirement since closing his office in 1948.

He had been hospitalized following a heart attack May 6 but had been released.

Doctor Stevens was one of three living founders of the Sioux Falls clinic.

Born in Lewis, Ia., August 10, 1884, Doctor Stevens made his home in O'Neill with his sister, Mrs. Bert Murnan, and worked in the Gallagher store. He was graduated from Creighton university, Omaha, in 1910. He interned for a year at St. Joseph's hospital, Omaha, before starting a practice there in 1911.

He went to Sioux Falls in 1915 and became associated with his cousin, Dr. Roy G. Stevens. He was a member of the Masonic lodge and Calvary cathedral in Sioux Falls.

His marriage to Nell Wilson took place in the Little Church Around the Corner in New York City August 13, 1925.

Survivors include: Widow; daughter—Mrs. Wayne Donahue of Sioux Falls; son—George E. of Omaha; sister—Mrs. Beatrice Gittens of Griswold, Ia.; brother—Joseph of Griswold; eight grandchildren; four great-grandchildren.

Burial was in Omaha at 11 a.m., Saturday, June 23, in Forest Lawn cemetery. Among those from O'Neill attending the rites were Mr. and Mrs. Homer E. Mullen (Mrs. Mullen is a cousin), Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Birmingham and daughter, Barbara, and Mr. and Mrs. H. E. Coyne.

The late Dr. Stevens was a perennial visitor at O'Neill at golf tournament time and missed this year's tournament because of his illness.
