There is only one change in the faculty of the high school. Sister M. Laurissa, the junior teacher, has been transferred to the international convent of the Sisters of St. Francis in Rome, Italy. She will leave from New York on Monday, August 20. Her sister, Sister M. Constance, will replace her as junior teacher.

Mother M. Agnesine will continue as superior and principal. Sister M. Emilia will be in charge of the senior class; Sisters Rose and Marina will teach the sophomore and freshman classes, respectively. Sister Christiana will be in charge of the library and will teach Latin and English.

Don Templemeyer will again coach the athletic teams and teach the commercial subjects. Miss Alvira Ramm will have the glee club and the voice department, while Mrs. F. J. Kubitsek will teach piano. Mr. Miller will be charge of the band.

Mother Agnesine and Sister Emilia left on Wednesday, August 15, for Buffalo, N.Y., where they are attending a Franciscan educational conference. The six-day convention of representatives of all schools taught by their congregation in the United States will convene for the purpose of drawing up a uniform code of education and a plan of curriculum to be introduced into all their schools in this country.
