**No Opposition at Brucellosis Hearing**

No protests were filed from any of the county's 37 townships in Wednesday's brucellosis hearing at the courthouse. A number of ranchers and stockmen, however, were present; also Dr. J. L. George, state veterinarian.

All female calves in the county will be vaccinated at government expense by a licensed veterinarian under the brucellosis program. Beef calves are to be vaccinated between 4- and 12-months-old; dairy cattle, between 4- and 8-months-old.

After a five-year period spot checks will be made. If there are no reactors the county will be officially designated as brucellosis free. If there are reactors, a stockman will be eligible for indemnity—\$32.50 on grade cattle; \$65 on purebred.

**Social Security Aide Coming**
