MARKET as it happened at the Wednesday, October 17, sale at the Butte Livestock Market:

We sold 616 butcher hogs—a top of \$15.85 for No. 1 hogs, \$13.35 to \$15.65 for No. 2's, fat backs again sows at \$14.25 to \$15.35, pigs in better demand than usual.

Cattle buyers from out state had local buyers in competition for the stock cattle. No choice to prime feeders offered but all the good yearlings sold at \$16.25 to \$17.75.

Calves of just good quality at \$18.75. A few to 20c. Good crossbred steers and heifers sold from 13c to 16½c while cows were 7c to 11c. Heavy heifers up to \$13.75. (This was a week ago.) See You Next Wednesday
