##### Study Government at Courthouse

The program was sponsored by the American Legion. George Wettlaufer of Page, county commander, presided at the general assembly opening; Julius D. Cronin, O'Neill attorney, made a statement on the purpose of county government; County Judge Louis W. Reimer administered the oaths of office.

Lunch was served by the Legion auxiliary; Mrs. Milo Landreth of Page, county president. After the assignments to the various offices, where the student officers worked alongside the regularly constituted officers, a mock trial was staged in the courtroom with District Judge D. R. Mounts presiding.

The widow, Bella, and a daughter, Miss Lillian, reside at the place.




