

**Feast On Holiday Mushroom Muffins**



MARVELOUS are muffins made with condensed cream of mushroom soup. Their subtle flavor and extra special texture bring magical mouthwatering moments . . . especially when served on the days of feasting along with that holiday bird.

**HOLIDAY MUFFINS**  
 2 cups sifted flour  
 1 tablespoon baking powder  
 1 tablespoon sugar  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1 can (1 1/2 cups) condensed cream of mushroom soup  
 1/2 cup chopped scalinats  
 1/4 cup melted shortening  
 1 egg, beaten

Sift dry ingredients into a bowl. Mix soup, walnuts, shortening and egg; add to flour mixture. Stir until well blended. Fill greased muffin tins 3/4 full. Bake in a hot oven (400° F.) about 20 minutes. Makes 12 muffins.

They'd make a special breakfast surprise some morning, too. You might like to vary this recipe by substituting condensed cream of chicken or cream of celery soups in place of the condensed cream of mushroom soup.

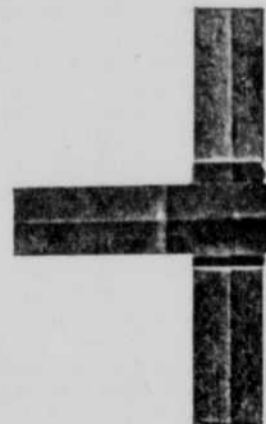
**Donald Johnson in Information Post**
