Church Scores Again in Clothing Drive

Christian Mothers Go Over Top

EWING—The Christian Mothers of St. Peter's Catholic church once again have gone over the top in the national clothing drive sponsored by their church. From November 18-24, eight hundred pounds of clothing was collected, paired, sorted as to size, warm or cold climates, packed and shipped to the Catholic Relief Service, WCVW New York, at a shipping cost of \$49.55.

The clothing is sent to areas where the need is the greatest. Since August 1 St. Peter's parish has collected a total of 1,491 pounds of clothing. Some clothes were sent to the Holy Rosary Mission, Pine Ridge, S.D.

Of the coffee strips collected, 437 total, 237 were sent to St. Augustine Indian Mission, Winnebago; 200 to other needy children. Six pounds of cancelled stamps were sent to the Jesuit Mission, stamp bureau, St. Louis, Mo.

A box of infant clothing is being shipped to the Pope's warehouse in Rome to be distributed to the needy. This is new clothing. Mrs. Mary Rotherham, who does much of this project of the church, devotes a great deal of time throughout the year. Her never-ending collection at present includes 70 pair of overalls and countless pairs of socks.

The Christian Mothers are grateful for all donations received from all the people, Mrs. Rotherham said.
