Muffin Pans Speed Baking

The holidays are over and it will be quite a while before you have to start spring housecleaning or planting garden, so now's the time to get some of those things done that you can't do any other time of the year.
This is the time of year when casseroles are so good. For something a bit different, make biscuits to go on top of the casserole and cut them with your doughnut cutter. The family will enjoy having something just a bit different served to them.
If you want a cookie cutter in a shape you don't have, take the ring from the inside of a coffee can top and bend it with the pliers into the shape of cookie cutter you want. You'll find it sharp enough to cut the dough and the only cost is your time and effort.
If the time is short in which to bake that meat loaf, put it in muffin pans instead. It won't take as long to bake and individual servings will be all ready for you. Try it!
Got a lot of "holes" left from doughnuts, String three of them on a toothpick and fry kabob fashion as you would any doughnut. It produces a novel "fried cake" and you don't have to any rerolling either.
Glass custard or baking cups are fine for poaching eggs. Break the egg into the custard cup and set in one inch of boiling water, in a pan or skillet.

You can do one for each member of the family and serve in the custard cup.
If you dislike getting your hands chilled from finding things in the home freezer, keep a pair of outing flannel gloves on top of the freezer and slip them on before you open the freezer.
Here are some hearty kraut and meat dishes that we think you'll want to try on your family. Spareribs and kraut are oldtimers but this way is a bit different.
APPLE KRAUT SPARE RIBS
One No. 2 can kraut, 2 cups chopped pared apples, 1 cup chopped celery, 1 medium sized onion (chopped), 2 teaspoons brown sugar, 2 matching spareribs (about 1 1/2 lbs. each), salt and freshly ground pepper. Combine kraut, apples, celery, onions and brown sugar, mix thoroughly. Place 1 section of ribs on rack in baking pan. Spread ribs with kraut stuffing. Cover the remaining rib section and season with salt and pepper. Bake, uncovered in moderate oven of 350 F. 1 1/2 hours, or until ribs are tender.

PORK HOCK AND KRAUT CASSEROLE
Four medium sized pork hocks (about 2 lbs.), 1 large apple, cored and sliced, 1 cup onion sliced, salt and pepper, 1 No. 2 1/2 can kraut.
In a three quart casserole, place pork hocks, arrange apple and onion slices over pork hocks and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Top with undrained kraut, cover and bake in moderate oven of 350 F. for 3 to 3 1/2 hours, or until pork hocks are done.
KRAUT PORK CHOPS WITH APPLE RINGS
One-fourth cup butter or margarine, 1/4 cup currant jelly, 4 loin pork chops, 1 No. 2 can kraut, 3 medium sized apples, cored and cut in rings, 1 cup

chopped onions.
In a skillet, melt butter or margarine and currant jelly, add apple rings and cook until apple rings are browned. Remove apple rings and place pork chops in skillet. Brown lightly on all sides. Meanwhile, combine kraut and onions, place on top of browned pork chops. Cover and cook 30 minutes over low heat. Uncover and place apple rings on top of kraut mixture, cover and continue cooking 30 minutes.
One of these days when the holidays are over, and you've eaten up all the fancy cakes, cookies, and candies, you'll want something simple and filling for dessert. Then's when you'll want to try this Ginger Bread recipe.
GINGE BREAD
One cup buttermilk, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 cup molasses, 2 teaspoons soda, 1 teaspoon allspice, 2 teaspoons ginger, 2 1/2 cups flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt.
Cream butter and add the sugar, molasses and buttermilk. Sift flour, salt, soda, allspice and ginger and add to liquid mixture. Mix well. Place in a well greased baking pan and bake in a moderate oven.
