The auction was very good. 623 head of hogs, 69 pigs were sold in less than 2 hours, 580 head of hogs were sent to Packers in localities where they have no pork.

The 200 head of cattle took about the same length of time to sell, but the prices on the light stock cattle (600 lbs. and down) seem to keep advancing each week in price, when our butcher cattle market seems to lose about 25c to 50c each week.

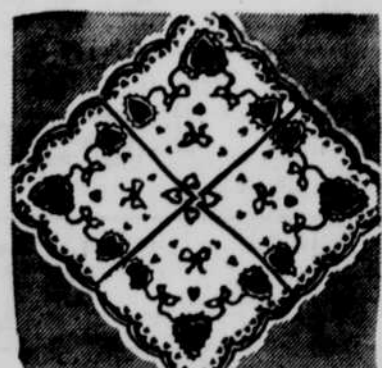
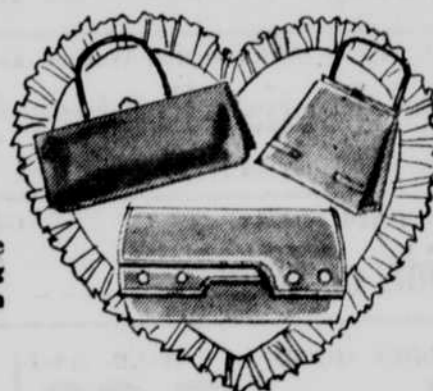
