"The Ranch" is Where My Heart Is, an article in the current Ladies Home Journal, features the Lee family of Brownlee-Forrest and Grace, the parents and four daughters, the Misses Jackie, Carolyn, Florence and Dorothy, all St. Mary Academy graduates.

Ranch life and all the little intimacies woven around a young wife, whose background for ranch work 26 years ago was an army life with her parents, is told in humorous experiences.

Mrs. Lee says: "Long hours don't seem like drudgery or even work. It's the difference between loving what you're doing and hating it."

Each daughter has contributed about \$350 a year toward her education, money earned working on the ranch in summers and from fall sales of cattle which the girls own on shares with their father.

Each of the girl's personalities is described and compared to "Little Women" by Louisa

May Alcott.

The girls, not members of the Catholic church, are remembered at O'Neill where they attended St. Mary's academy where they were boarding students. One is now married and three are in college.
