**Beatrice Foods Declares Dividend**

A quarterly dividend of 45 cents per share of common stock was declared by the Beatrice Foods Company following a meeting of the board of directors Friday, March 1, in Chicago, Ill.

This new cash dividend of 45 cents per common share became payable on additional shares of common stock to be distributed on Tuesday, March 5, on the basis of one share for each two already held by stockholders of record Tuesday, February 5. This stock split was announced by the board of directors on December 1.

Quarterly dividends of 3-3-3 cents per share on the 3-3-3 per cent cumulative convertible prior preferred stock and of \$1.125 per share on the 4-1-2 per cent cumulative preferred stock also were declared by the board of directors.

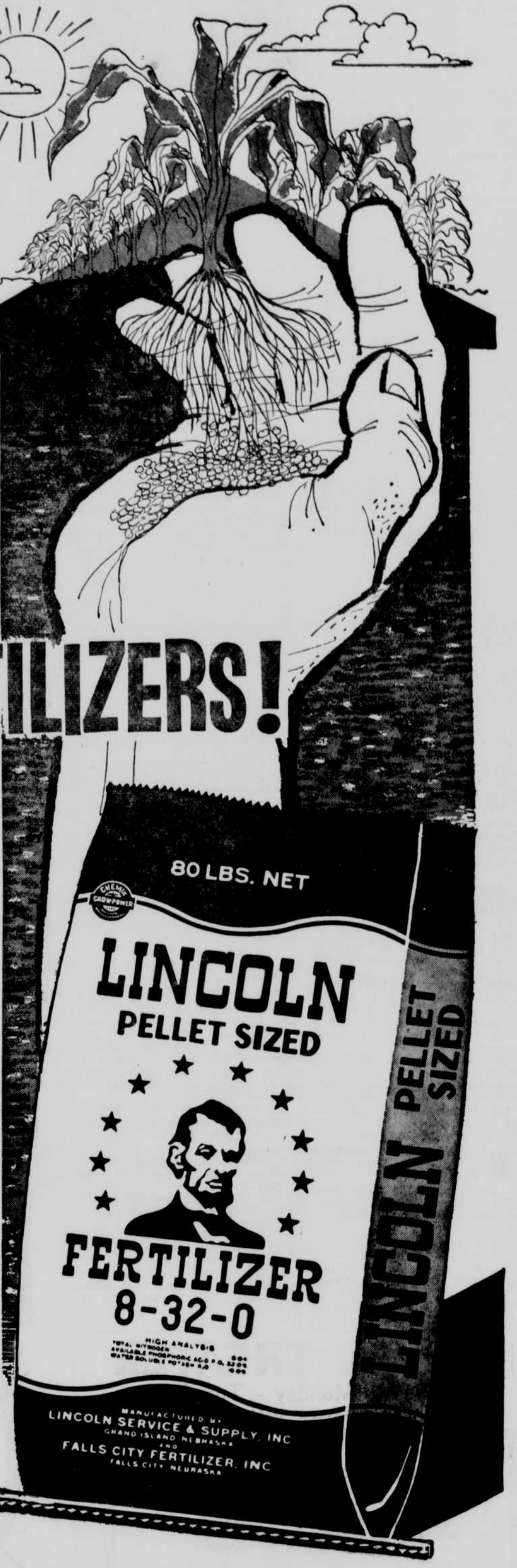
