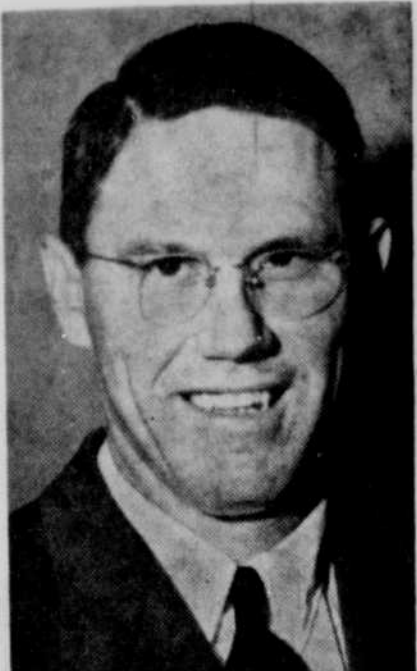

The Otts were compelled to draw a comparison, weather-wise, between their 42d anniversary and their wedding day. Forty-two years ago the day dawned calm, clear and cool 12 miles north of O'Neill. Snow on the ground measured two feet in depth with drifts up to 15 and 16 ft. deep. There was a trail leading to town. Only conveyance was team and sled.

"Folks didn't wait for a snow-pow to come along in those days, declared Mr. Ott. "They simply threw a scoop shovel in the back end of the box—just in case a horse got into deep snow. They also took along some hay and a bag of oats.

"The snowbound trail usually led through pastures, fields and fences. First few times through was tough going," he recalls, but the trail soon became packed and frozen.

"Their 42d wedding day saw temperatures in the 60's, a breeze from the north and some dust in the air.
