STAR—Mr. and Mrs. Lyle Johnson will go to Lincoln this week where Mr. Johnson is to receive a medical checkup.

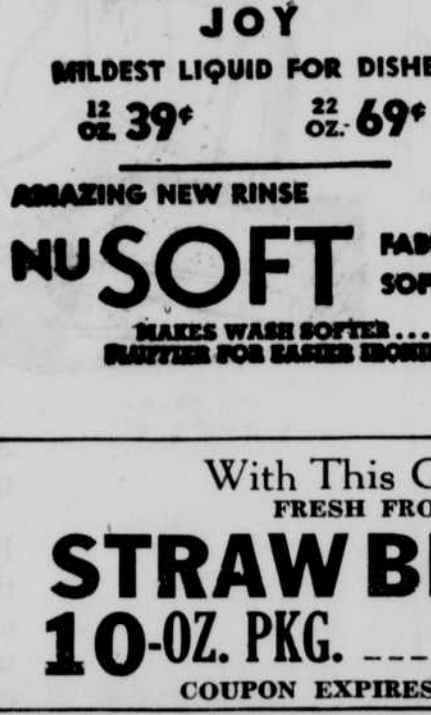
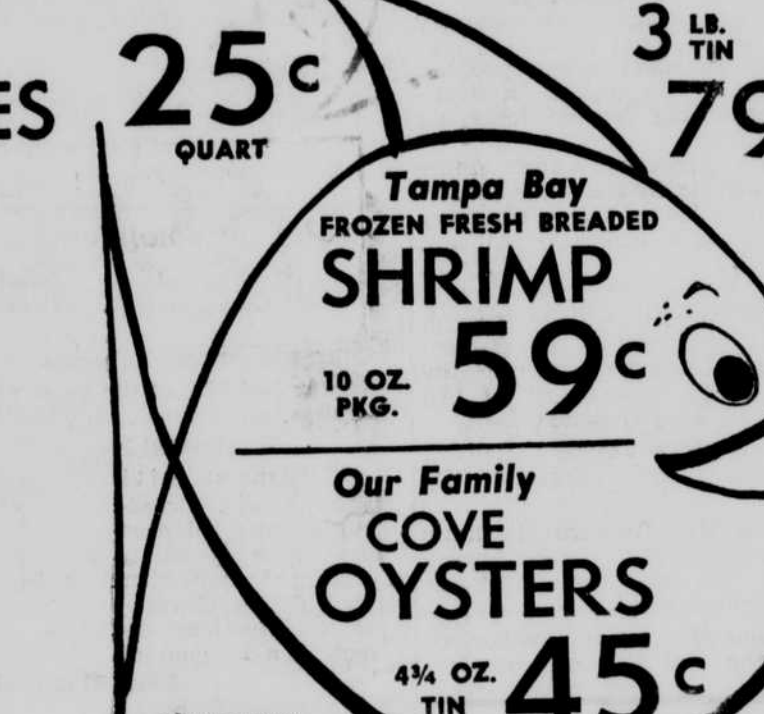

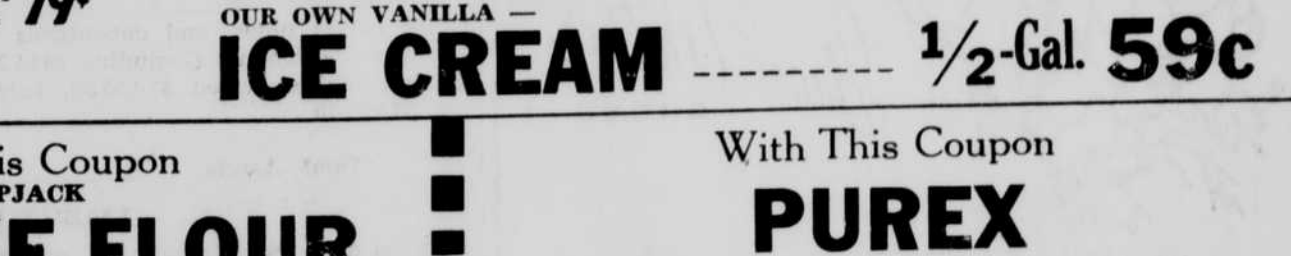
