 Extreme top on butcher hogs was \$19.40 with the majority of good hogs selling from \$18.75 to \$19.15. Very few hogs of even the heavy weights sold below \$18.25. Quite a number of sows are beginning to show up in the run and they sold from \$15.50 to \$18.10. Weaning pigs sold at \$16.50 each and feeder shoats sold from \$20.50 to \$21.80 per cwt.
