Cattle Receipts, 3,026 head. Highlighted by a long string of nearly 2,000 head of Charley Peterson's Choice Lazy F Brand Hereford and Angus this was one of the years outstanding auctions. New seasons top prices were made on both steers and heifers, with weights of 375 to 475 lb. averages on steers selling from \$24.50 to \$27.05 in strings of upwards of 100 head to a lot. Comparable heifer calves of the same weight sold at \$21.50 to \$22.90 cwt.

The results of the sale were a tribute to Mr. Peterson's quality cattle and were well and aggressively received by all buyers.
