Mr. and Mrs. William Petsche attended the first solemn mass of their cousin, Rev. Henry Schorn in Atkinson Monday morning.



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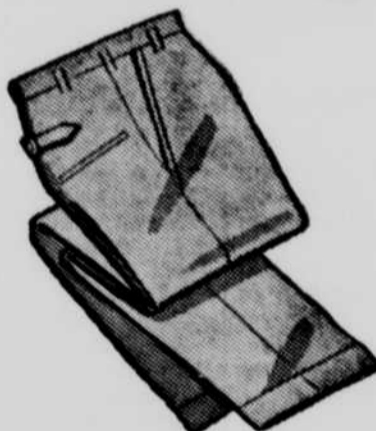
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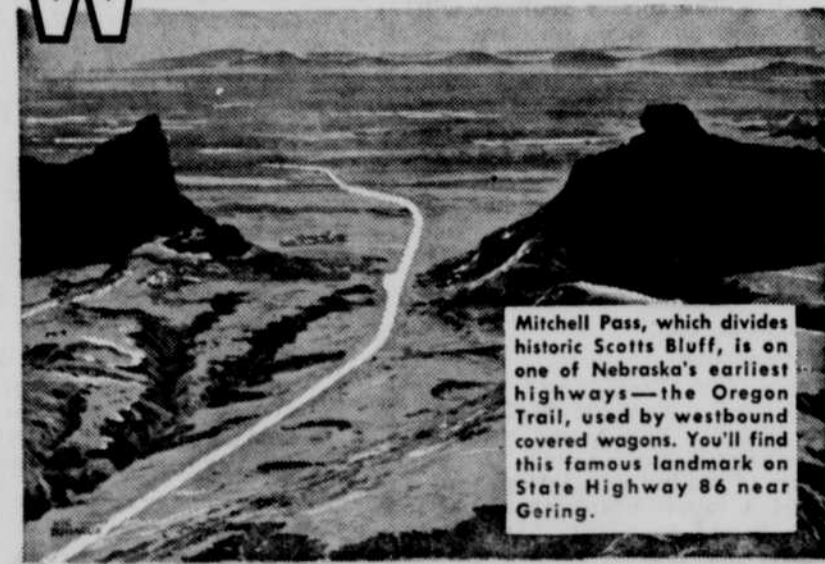
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
