two passenger - mail - express trains. In 1954 the officials pointed to a 60-thousand-dollar annual loss. Provo said the annual loss is now 225-thousand-dollars. C&NW has been pressing for a hearing before the Nebraska state railway commission, but no date has been set.
The S-T-A counsel, Einar Viren, Omaha attorney, wants to take depositions from C&NW management on the so-called "out-of-pocket" expense climb with reference to the two trains. During the three years the S-T-A pointed to certain gains in passenger revenues.
Omaha-Chadron is a mainline and the freight operation is "highly profitable", Secretary Watson said.
Presently there is no other form of passenger transportation between Gordon and Valentine—a distance of 92 miles.

Holt Schools Get \$74,062 Allotment

A total of \$74,062.97 is being allotted from state apportionment, school lands and county fines and licenses.
The state apportionment to the county was \$44,912.44. Part of this is divided equally among operating school districts, paying each district \$161.44. Part is distributed to operating school districts according to pupil census, paying \$5.65 per pupil.
County fines and licenses amounted to \$16,755.45, which is divided among all county school districts. Districts contracting with other districts for instruction receive a payment from fines and licenses though they are not eligible to receive the state apportionment. The amount paid per pupil from fines and licenses is \$3.92, according to Miss Alice L. French, county superintendent.
