Donald Schoenle returned Saturday having completed his freshman year at the seminary at Elkhorn.

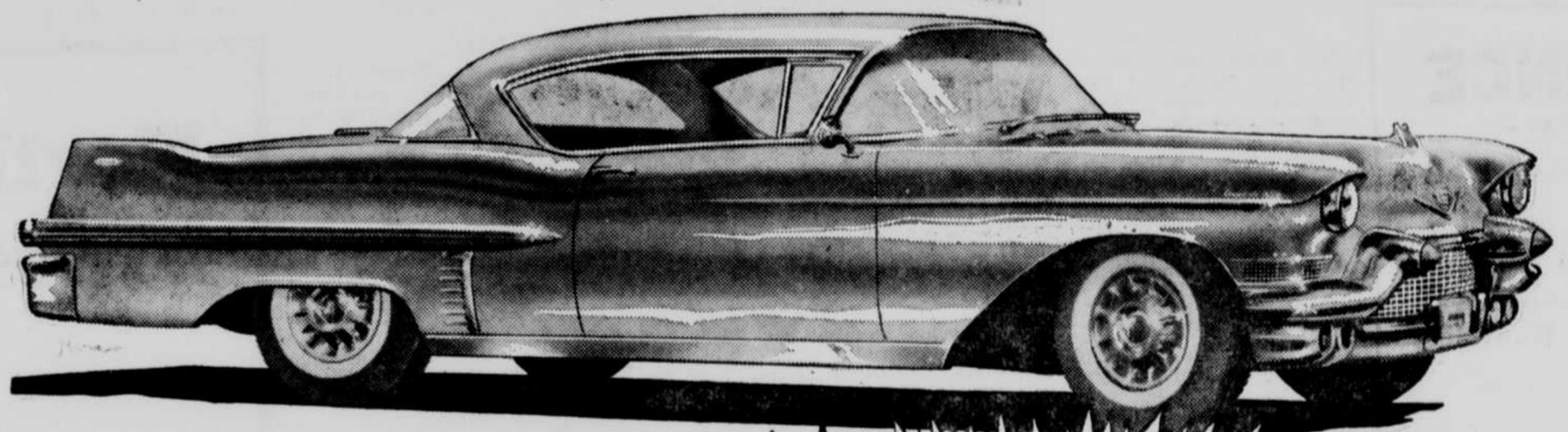
