Holt Cancer Drive Reaches \$1,195.12

"We wish to express our gratitude to the citizens of Holt county for their contributions to the Holt county cancer fund drive," Mrs. Edward M. Gallagher, chairman, and Archie Bright, treasurer, said Wednesday in a joint statement.

Sixty percent of the funds collected is devoted to the division or unit. Some research is supported by the division. Cost of local fund-raising is included in the 40 percent. Twenty-five percent supports a nationally-administered research program.

In April, the Nebraska division of the American Cancer Society made grants totaling \$49,686. Awards were made to nine institutions and two scientists in the state.

Harry Cadwallader Oldest Present at Family Reunion

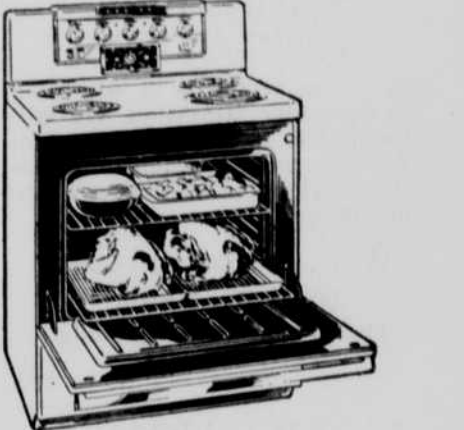
