Indications at this time are that there will be a sizeable amount of Blue Grass harvested in this area.

We would like to call to your attention, that in many cases Blue Grass can be hayed and threshed more profitably than it can be stripped. It can also be windrowed and combined, same as small grain.

If you are drying strippings, buyers like them clean and free of sand. Avoid too much heating in the green strippings; it will hurt the germination of the seed. This is the kind of seed we would like to buy or clean.
