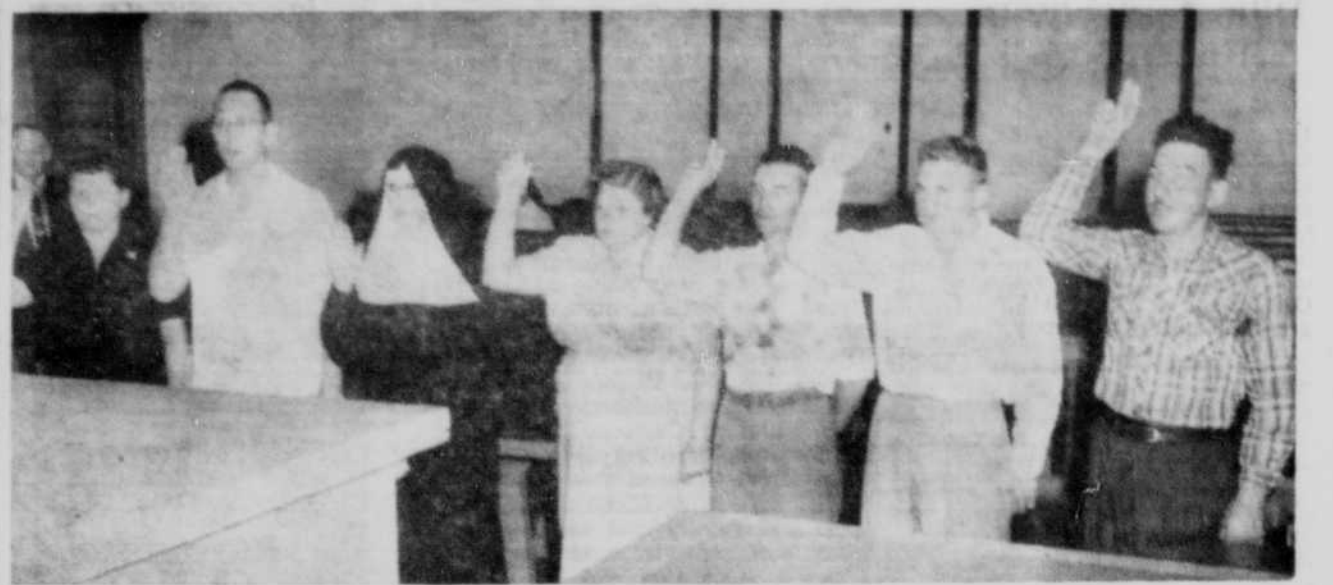

1884. Others who followed in membership in the eighties included: James Binkard, Hattie Binkard, Alexander Kelly, Lucina Kelly, John Moser, Barbara Moser, John Reynolds, Anna Moser, Sarah Emerson, Cella Reynolds, Mrs. S. A. Rosenkrans, Dudley Gager, Moma Rosenkrans, William McWhorter and Elia McWhorter.

In September, 1885, the Sunday-school was organized.

First quarter-century of the church paralleled the life of Reverend Rosenkrans and 90 persons joined. He died in 1907.

Church Is Moved

At a congregational meeting April 15, 1908 it was voted to move the church from a high knoll to its present location.
