Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bellin have received word that their son, Sgt. Charles Dale Bellin, has arrived in Korea. His address is: NG2772600 Co. B, 2nd Med. Tk Bn., 40 th Armored, APO 7, San Francisco, Calif.

This is an excerpt from a letter to his parents:
"Have reached my new home. This place is a hole. My luck has really run out. Four soldiers are here on this mountain. They just cut ledges out of the mountains, like terraces, and set a few quonset huts and a row of tanks. I can't describe this place. I will be a tank gunner on an old M46, similar to the old 47.

"This company is parked on the east side of a hill and the other three companies on the other side across the valley. The camp fence is about 40 feet in front of my hut and there are 15 or 20 Korean men and women standing by the fence.

"Please, tell everyone to write. I don't care what, just so they write. Keep them coming.—Dale"
