Carroll G. French to Serve 3 Years

PAGE—Carroll G. French, who was born at Page and attended Page high school, is one of 35 young men and women who will go overseas next fall as special term (three years) missionaries of the Methodist church.

He will go to the Belgian Congo, Africa, for agricultural education work.

Presently he is taking a six-weeks orientation course at Scarritt college at Nashville, Tenn. After finishing orientation, he and the others in the group will leave for 14 countries of Asia, Africa, North and South America. The group, representing 19 states, will teach all levels from kindergarten through college and do evangelistic work.

Mr. French's work will include demonstrating modern farming methods.

Mr. French studied four years at the University of Nebraska and was graduated in 1954 with a bachelor of science degree in agriculture. This spring he studied at Garret Bible Institute, Evanston, Ill.

For two years he was an administrative officer for the air force at Webb air force base, Big Springs, Tex.
