RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors, with the exception of open class livestock, will be furnished with an exhibitor's ticket without cost, which will let them enter their exhibits, but which will not be good for admission to the grounds.
- Exhibitors in open class livestock will be charged a nominal entry fee of \$1.00 and issued an exhibitor's ticket which will admit the exhibitor to the grounds for the day's program.
- A stall fee of 50 cents per single stall will be charged in the open class.
- Membership tickets are good for one year.
- No premiums will be awarded on anything not listed in this list.
- All stock must be entered on or before Monday, August 12, 1957.
- Entries of cut flowers will be accepted for entry until Tuesday, August 13, at 9:00 a.m. No other entries can be made after 11 a.m., same day.
- The books will be open for entry articles one month before the Fair, and blanks for the entries will be mailed on application to the Secretary of the Board.
- Proofs of breeding of all purebred animals must be furnished if required.
- An exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges will be promptly excluded from the competition.

New Coliseum Will Be Used This Year

LINCOLN—The new \$400,000 state fair coliseum will be ready for use during the 1957 exposition August 31-September 6, Fair Board Secretary Edwin Schultz has announced.

The new coliseum, on which construction was started immediately after last year's fair, is 200 feet by 280 feet with an arena 200 feet by 85 feet.

Seating capacity for arena events will be approximately 4,000 people. For stage shows, with chairs placed in the arena, the capacity will be approximately 7,500.

The arena will be surrounded by a wide concourse to provide exhibit space and to take care of a heavy flow of traffic.

During the 1957 fair, the new coliseum will be the scene of open class livestock judging, and also the site of a quarter horse show with both performances and halter classes.
