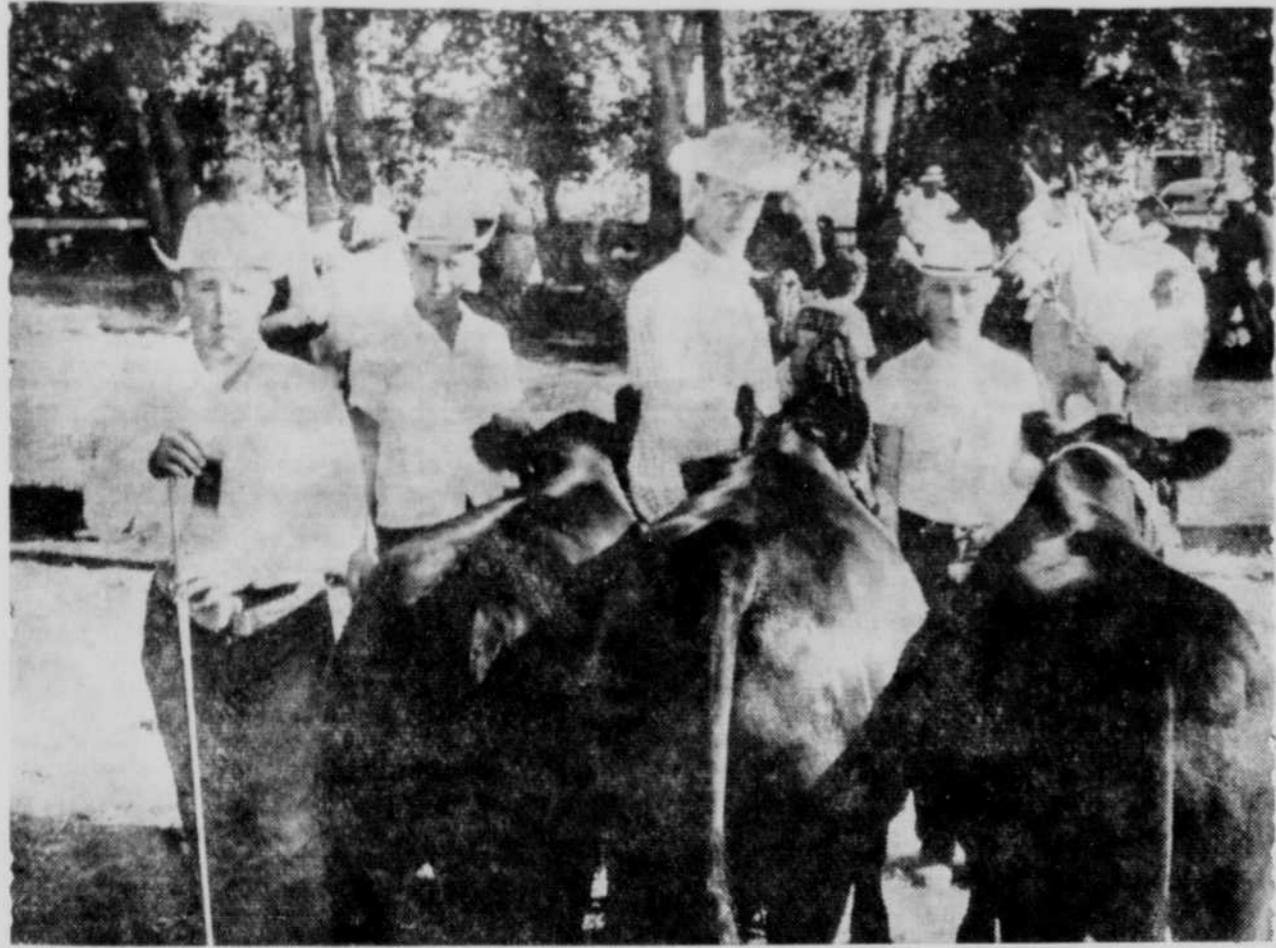


# Camera Goes to the Fair!

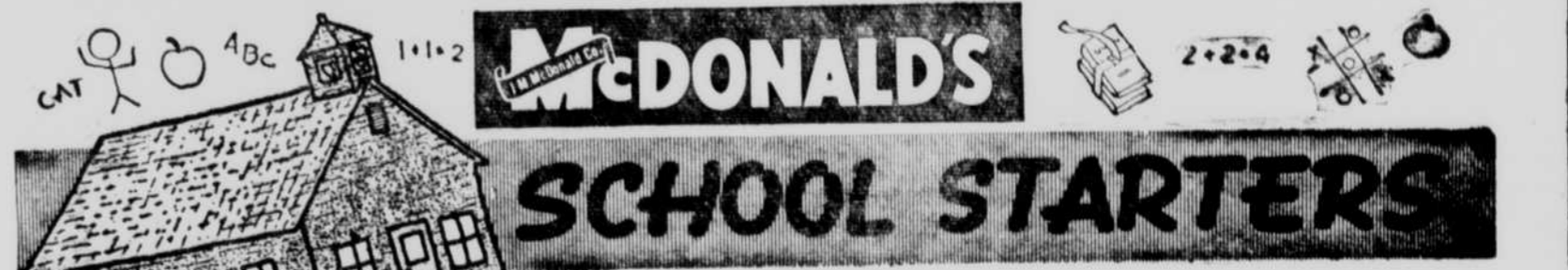
