LINCOLN — There may be a motor vehicle license plate shortage when counties send in their orders for additional plates next year.

Assistant Director Owen Boyles of the motor vehicle division said an attempt is being made to obtain 100,000 pounds of metal. Applications for authority to buy the metal have not been approved yet.

"Even our saving all scraps and using them for tabs will not meet the need," he explained.

He estimated the state will be about 26,000 pairs of plates short.
